



## Be Screen SMART

By.....

### Taking regular eye breaks



Make sure you look away from the screen at least every 15 minutes

### Sitting properly and comfortably with a device

Support your back - don't hunch. Make sure your device is not on your lap.



### Taking finger breaks



Rest your fingers when doing lots of typing. Do finger exercises on your table.

### Getting up and moving



Stand up - stretch and move from where you have been working.

# What if I can't afford a device?

School devices will be available.



School has made a significant investment - but we can't afford 1 device for every child in Years 4-6.

# Will the school provide IT support?

The school employs Norrcom as our key IT support. We have weekly onsite visits from our IT technician.

As a school we are unable to provide IT support for issues with individual devices that are not related to connectivity with our network.

We are happy to give advice and help with troubleshooting.
