

School Donations

A huge thank you to everyone who has paid the school donation so far this year. It makes a really big difference to our ability to run the school, provide the resources, additional programmes, teacher aide support, events and experiences which support our high quality outcomes.

We currently have a shortfall of \$40k in school donations which we haven't received. If you haven't yet paid any of the donation but can possibly contribute to the school, we would very, very much appreciate your support. We do appreciate things are tough for everyone with increased housing, food and transport/petrol costs and it is important we can keep paying our costs and avoid cutting any additional programmes or resources.

Almost all schools across NZ receive \$150 per child per year additional funding from the government in place of the 'parent donation', along with a raft of other school based benefits PLUS significantly higher base funding per child from the government each year.

We, as a school in an area deemed a high socio economic area, are given the lowest per capita funding for children, no \$150 grant per child per year and no access to most additional in school support programmes. It leaves us very, very reliant on you, as parents/caregivers, to 'top up' the gap.

Thank you again, it is always difficult to be asking you for support, we do appreciate everything you all currently contribute in terms of your time and your support, as well as financially. Thank you.

Lunch wrappers and litter

The windy days also mean that food wrappers end up being blown around the playground. To cut down the amount of litter blowing around the school we are asking that children put their wrappers etc back in their lunchboxes as well as any uneaten food. It means that you get to see what they have and haven't eaten each day, as well as ensuring food wrappers don't blow out of the bins and across the school.

Rail Safety Week 7-13 August! We know that you don't just want tamariki and whānau to get Movin' on the way to and from school, you also want them to be super safe! Please talk with your children about the importance of not going near the train tracks without an adult or, if they are old enough and have your permission, that they look very carefully before crossing.

Book Care

Just a reminder that book bags are essential for every child. It is important to have a clean, dry book bag to transport books to and from school. When books go into school bags, they are at risk of water bottle spills, lunch spills and getting scrunched up with all the other items in the school bag. Our books are a very precious asset for everyone to enjoy and unfortunately, I have had to dispose of a number of books with water, mud and food spill damage recently.

Please ensure your child has a book bag and emphasise the importance of keeping books clean and dry. If you have any shopping bags labelled 'Learning Hub' they are part of our boomerang bag scheme and should be returned to the Hub please. If you have surplus reusable shopping bags at home that you can donate to the Hub, I would really appreciate them please.

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We have a commitment to the development of our Y-Kids while they are under our care. We do our best to ensure our activities fall into the following three categories: Active, Lifeskills and Create.




