Quiz Night Thanks – Saturday 10th June at the Cossie Club, Upper Hutt

A huge thank you to everyone who came along to the Quiz Night on Saturday, it was amazing to have so many people together and the evening was really fun to be part of. You raised \$7,241.93 and this week we have also been donated \$5,000 from the Upper Hutt City Council for our pest trapping programme from their Environmental Grant. That gives us enough money to start work next term on our new ANZAC area around the flagpole and also to buy all the trapping equipment we need to start our local pest eradication programme with the students around Silverstream.

I know it is really tough for many of you financially at the moment with all the increased costs to families so I really did want to thank you for school donations that have been paid this year. We have over 80% of donation money in, all of this money goes towards supporting children in the school. It pays for teacher aide support, new library books, new reading books, maths equipment etc. Without your donation money we would not be able to balance the books at the end of the year.
