Principal's Message

Kia ora koutou,

Our thoughts are with everyone who have suffered a great deal over the last couple of weeks due to the weather in parts of the North Island. It is hard to imagine the hardships they are now facing. Many of you will have families affected by this and as a school we will keep our eyes open to ways we may be able to help others get through at this time.

If you have any thoughts on what we could do as a school community to give something or offer something to children and families in need around Hawkes Bay, Coromandel and Northland we would be keen to get something underway over the coming weeks. It could be that we link in with Salvation Army, Red Cross, other community initiatives for toys, clothes, food, etc. offer respite care away from the flooded areas, set up home stay arrangements with another school, the list goes on.

Civil Defence Emergency Hub

As a school we are a local hub in the event of an emergency and as such we are well supported by Civil Defence staff.

In the event of an emergency our priority, once the children are all safe and accounted for, would be to reunite them with you as quickly as possible. The easiest way for us to do this is to gather the children in house groups outside the house group coloured perspex (outside rooms 16-19).

In that way you would find all your children together rather than split across 2-3 classrooms. If that area of the school was not usable we would gather where we could but still in the four separate house groups.

To collect your children, you would just need to head to house group and all of your children would be together. We have both electronic and paper attendance rolls available should we lose cell phone coverage and have to check children off on paper. Hopefully we will never need to use this procedure but be assured it is in place should we ever need it.

NZEI Teachers Union Meeting

On the **afternoon of Monday 27**th **February** teachers are eligible to attend a union meeting arranged in Lower Hutt for all teachers across the region. In the meeting they will be voting to accept or reject the latest offer from the government to teachers.

Many schools in the area are closing early on that day. We are going to be able to **stay open** with the staff who are not attending the meeting covering classes. **We will therefore be open as usual on Monday 27**th **February and finishing at the usual time of 3 pm**. Your children however may be in a different classroom for the afternoon. Nearer the time we will let you know which room to collect them from on the day. Many thanks.

PEP's (Personalised Education Plans) Term 1 - Meet the Teacher

Thank you for coming along to the PEP meetings. It was great to see so many people. If you have any concerns at all about your child, please do contact the classroom teacher. We have a wonderfully talented team and they are always happy to talk with you. Make sure you are also connected to **Seesaw** as all of our school messages go out via this app. If you need help in getting connected to Seesaw your child's teacher can help you.

Science in the Curriculum

As you may already be aware we have a great opportunity this year to have Erin Edmonds teaching science lessons as our in house expert in our Year 2-6 classes. Mrs Edmonds has a science background and is working with The House of Science and other outside experts to develop the Silverstream School Science curriculum and ensure all Year 2-6 children get a half day of primary science teaching once a fortnight. Teachers then follow up in the classroom as part of literacy, science or their topic/inquiry work.

School wide topic/Inquiry - EXPLORATION

This term all classes are studying **Exploration** as their topic with the Year 5-6 team concentrating on **Navigation** at **Sea with a focus on the early navigation of the Pacific.** The Year 3-4 team are exploring the **Sea and Oceans** and The Year 1-2 team are **exploring their local area** around Silverstream and Upper Hutt.

Class Timetables

Your child's teacher will be sharing with you their class timetable so that you can see on a typical week what is being taught and when. Occasionally there are changes or relieving teachers but on most days this timetable will apply.

Swimming

We are excited to still be able to run swimming in Year 0-2 each week in the school pool. Other year groups will have a block of swimming to take part in later in the year.

PMP – Perceptual Motor Programme

We are also running the PMP programme again in Year 0-1 this year. PMP is an excellent way to help students develop stronger gross motor skills including balance, left and rightness, catching a ball and hand-eye coordination.

Library Sessions

All children also have the opportunity to attend the school library and take books out once a week. The library is also open at lunchtime each day and Mrs Bolitho is an expert at helping children find books they might be looking for in our very well stocked school library.





2023 Kiwi English, Mathematics and Science Competitions



Dear Parents and Caregivers

The University of Canterbury is offering your child the opportunity to participate in the KIWI English, Mathematics and Science competitions. These competitions take place annually and are designed by New Zealand teachers for New Zealand students based on the New Zealand Curriculum. For further information, please consult the CAM website www.canterbury.ac.nz/cam.

The competitions are open to all Year 5-10 students in English, Mathematics and Science. Students can enter in one or more subjects. Each competition will provide parents/caregivers with an individual student report of their child's overall performance. These are available through your school. The supervised online tests will take place in the last 3 weeks of Term 2 and the first week of Term 3. The competitions are to be administered at school under exam conditions and supervised.

All participating students will receive a certificate and a prize will be awarded to the top student nationally in each competition. If two or more students share the same top score then the prize is awarded to the student with the highest speed and accuracy.

NOTE: Our policy is **not** to release test papers. The tests are provided primarily as a competition and not as a teaching resource.




