
Many thanks also to the Tuis sponsorship/fundraising drive, over the last month they've purchased 10 of these tracksuit tops.

Mr Four Eyes Foundation Eyesight Screening

We have the opportunity for our whole school to have their eyesight screened by the Mr Four Eyes Foundation. This foundation provides a quick and simple screening test.

We will use a high-tech portable machine that is a simple, and non-invasive way to screen eyesight. This gives a rough idea of the prescription in their eyes, that information is used to help identify any students that need further testing by an optometrist.

Your child will be screened at some point during the first 3 weeks of Term 3. The process is quick and simple and a whole class can be done in approximately 25 minutes. I will then contact any parents/carers of students whose screening highlights that they need to see an optometrist.

If you **DO NOT** wish your child to be screened or if they are already under an optometrist's care for glasses, please let me know that you do not wish your child's eyes to be checked and that you want to opt out of the Mr Four Eyes Screening.




