Principal's Message

Kia ora koutou,

World Autism Awareness Day

This is on Sunday 2nd April. We are aware, as many of you are, of the number of children with ASD who need further support in all schools, but a lack of funding makes that impossible for schools to afford. We work to ensure we give us much support as we can to all children but are very restricted by ongoing sources of money to pay for essential additional staff.

Our own data shows we have over 50 different 'conditions' which children and their families live with each day. This can be as diverse as having severe allergies, needing to use a wheelchair for mobility, managing heart conditions to severe learning processing challenges. We love working with diverse students who represent a huge range of additional capabilities but are acutely frustrated by not being able to provide the service which all children deserve to receive. The Board are aware of the challenges and are super supportive in trying to find resourcing.

Education will become a hot election issue this year and I would encourage you to ask the people standing for election what their plan is to ensure all children with additional needs are given the proper level of funding. We do believe there is enough money already in the system but sadly very little of that education portfolio money seems to trickle down to children in the classroom currently.

In the meantime, World Autism Day gives us a chance to recognise and celebrate students with ASD and the amazing contribution they make in our world.

Easter Term Break

Next week is a 4 day week at school, Friday 7th April is Good Friday and a public holiday for Easter.

School resumes on Monday 24th April (*note; we don't have a teacher only day on 24th April, other local schools however might*).

ANZAC Day Commemoration

On Monday 24th April school is open and we will have in the afternoon an ANZAC commemoration ceremony from 1.30 pm around the flagpole in the school grounds. The children will be learning why we have ANZAC Day in NZ and what it is about. All schools are closed for ANZAC Day Tuesday 25th April.

Island Bay Marine Reserve

Earlier this term Room 21 visited the Rocky Shore at Island Bay. Below are some of their stories...

The Rocky Shore

The Rocky Shore is a place in Wellington. There is a Bait House known as the marine centre by the rocky shore. In the Bait House there are touch pools. A touch pool is where you hold sea creatures like starfish, hermit crabs, sea cucumber, anemones and other harmless animals.

Crabs

Crabs can sometimes pinch but they usually don't mean to because if we try to grab them, they get scared so they try to protect themselves.

Starfish

Did you know that starfish grow multiple legs? Starfish suck up little stones and spit them out. Starfish are harmless.

Octopus

Octopus legs can get chopped off and then the octopus can grow them back. When octopus are scared or nervous, they spit out ink. Octopuses have eight legs.

Fish

Fish have scales and they don't eat much. When fish get nervous or scared, they swim down low. When fish are in a group, you call them a school.

Plastic in the Sea

If we leave plastic on the ground, it will blow into the drains and the drains lead to the Upper Hutt river, then Petone Beach and then to the Wellington Harbour. In the Wellington Harbour, there are beautiful fish, starfish, crabs, little sharks, seahorse and bits of other beautiful sea creatures. Sea animals get poisoned from rubbish and die. We need to not use plastic and rubber, and just not litter. We need to look after our sea animals.

The Rocky Shore

The rocky shore is a place where kids can go to explore the rocks and sea creatures. Amazingly, there are touch tanks where you can feel and hold sea creatures.

Anemones

Sea anemones are another sea creature. Sea anemones suck fingers because they think they are fish. They stick to rocks so predators don't harm them. Did you know that their long arms hide in their bodies when other sea creatures come close to them.

Tides

The rocky shore has different stages. Splash zone, high tide zone, mid tide zone, low tide zone and subtidal zone. Every zone has different sea creatures. For example, the splash zone would have sea animals that don't go underwater but get splashed. In the subtidal zone, there are creatures that stay underwater like seahorse and coral. There is one more called above high tide zone. This zone has seagulls and oyster catchers.

The Great Pacific Garbage Patch

The Great Pacific Garbage Patch is a big area of plastic in the ocean. Sadly, there is more plastic in the world than there are stars in the universe! So, don't use plastic or it will get worse. If we treat our planet like this, we will have no sea life left. So, Stop!!

The Rocky Shore is an area of rocks by the seashore. There are tides and levels of the rocky shore. When the tide is in, it covers the rock pools and fills it with creatures. When the tide is out, it leaves the rock pools which have some creatures left behind.

In New Zealand, if you go to Island Bay in Wellington, you can find rock pools filled with amazing sea creatures including dogfish, hermit crabs, sea cucumbers, glass shrimp, sea anemones, starfish and many more.

Star Fish

Starfish are interesting creatures. They eat by wrapping themselves around their prey. They then turn their stomach inside out to swallow their prey whole! There are a lot of types of starfish.

Hermit Crabs

Hermit Crabs have a shell that they use to protect themselves from predators that eat them. When hermit crabs grow bigger, they outgrow their shell so they leave their shell behind and set off on a journey to find a new shell.

Sea anemones

Sea anemones have stinging tentacles that they use to catch their prey. Although their tentacles are stinging, it's only stinging to their prey, not us. You may not believe this but sea anemone can swim!

Project Reef

Project Reef is a reef 11km off the Taranaki Coast and 23 meters below the water. The base of the reef is made out of rocks. Over time the rocks are worn down by water creating cracks and holes that provide shelter for small creatures.

Marine Debris

Marine debris is litter in the ocean. It poisons the sea and its creatures. Fish and seabirds get stuck in the rubbish. Marine debris is affecting the sea's living things. People should stop using plastic and use a different material that can dissolve in seawater. If not, our beautiful sea will turn into a junkyard and we don't want that.




