Principal's Message

Kia ora koutou,

Whakatau – welcome to new children and families

We have our termly welcome Whakatau in the school hall at 2pm on Friday 16th February. Please come along if your child or you are new to Silverstream School since our last Whakatau in Week 2 of Term 4 2023. We would love the opportunity to welcome you to the Silverstream whanau. We start in the Learning Hub (library) at 2 pm and are usually finished by 2.20 pm in the school hall.

Weekly Assemblies

We continue this year with weekly assemblies every Friday in the school hall from 2pm – 3pm, everyone is very welcome to come along. Next Friday the 16th February we will have our Whakatau first, then run straight into school assembly and Principals Awards.

If your child has special pens and pencils or lovely pencil cases etc, please be mindful that we would much prefer expensive and special stationery be left at home. It is very difficult for teachers to manage other children wanting to play with or use attractive pens and pencils, they are also easily lost in a classroom environment.

No Toys or Special Items

Please remind your children not to bring toys and special items to school unless they have a specially planned lesson at school for which they need it. We can't always keep toys and special items safe and it is much better to keep them at home. Many thanks.

Bikes/Scooters in the Playground

A reminder to always <u>walk</u> bikes and scooters through the grounds. We have had a couple of near misses with children on their bikes with small children around them.

School Road Patroller thanks

A huge thank you to the students who have taken up a role as Road Patrollers this term. They have been amazing and we have been very proud of how quickly they have learnt their new jobs. The roads are very busy!

School donation – a big thank you

A huge thank you to everyone who has already paid the school donation – you are amazing. We are so reliant on the donations as we are not eligible for the government donation scheme as our equity index (decile) is too high to receive any additional funding. We have the lowest per student funding ratio and also aren't able to be part of the donation scheme. It does leave us very dependent on parents being able to pay the donation to continue to provide teacher aides, paper, art materials, science materials and PE equipment for the children. If you haven't yet got around to the school donation, I do know things are tough for families at the moment but any amount really does help us make the books balance.



Celebrations

Sophie Barron attended the NZ Suzuki Summer Camp in Masterton over the school holidays with her violin- the culmination of a year's hard work, including learning all music from memory. She attended 3 lessons per day for 5 days, with two group concerts and one very intimidating solo concert. Well done Sophie, we are all so very proud of you!!

DONATIONS TO SILVERSTREAM SCHOOL

For the Board to provide quality education and up to date resources that we all expect for our children, we need to raise a large amount of community funds. This is to meet the difference between our Government Grant and our ongoing expenditure. Our ability to offer additional services such as Reading Recovery and IT and other programmes is heavily dependent on money raised from parent donations, the fundraising team and Community grants.

Silverstream School Board of Trustees has set the 2024 school donations as follows:

First and/or only child - \$220 Second child in the family - \$200 No donation is requested for subsequent children in the family *Families are CAPPED at \$420 in total per family*

All donations are tax deductible.

Kindo will provide a link to a tax receipt so you can complete your claim. You can claim tax credits for donations of more than \$5. You can claim 33.33 cents of your total donations.

Silverstream School collects all donations and payments via the KINDO app or alternatively payments can be made through the school office via eftpos/cash.

Kindo allows you to load money in intervals affordable to you and use the balance to offset payables and/or donations.



KINDO (Donations/Payables)

If you are new to Silverstream School you would have received a link for KINDO for your child/ren. If you have not yet received a copy of the link please contact the school office.

All donations (tax deductible) and payables (not tax deductible) are loaded into KINDO.

All payables incur GST and are owed by the child's parents to the school. These could be for an external activity your child has chosen to undertake such as touch, basketball, netball or the ICAS exams.

LUNCHES

There is an option to purchase lunch items via the Ezlunch within the KINDO app. The businesses and menus are included, with specific cut off times daily. These are delivered to the school office and taken to the classroom by the senior helpers.

MERCHANDISE

The school shop has the option to purchase house t-shirts, school polo shirts and school/house hats.

If you have any trouble with loading your KINDO account or the KINDO app, please contact 0508 4 KINDO (0508 4 54636), they are amazing and deal with any problems quickly.


