We are now in Week 7 of an 11 week term, and only a few weeks away from an Easter break.

This term we have been fortunate to welcome some new support staff members onto the Silverstream School team. All three are friendly people and bring a variety of skills to our school. They are:

-Jared Nicol, who is a former student of ours. He is an avid footballer who has been running around on the football field with the children during break times.

-Ange Aslett, who many of you will know from her years of running the YMCA before and after school programmes at Silverstream School.

-Nicole Penny, who is helping out on a casual basis as a teacher aide around the school. Welcome aboard!

Silverstream School has a focus on being the best we can be for our students and community. We are constantly tweaking what our akonga (students) are learning in class, during extra curricular groups and programmes, building on our school culture and teacher practice, and working on developing our partnerships with students, parents and caregivers.

Our academic focus is on having high expectations of what our children can achieve, and that all students leave Silverstream School set up for success at intermediate. One subject we want to look at closely is mathematics. We are putting a programme in place that we are hoping, in partnership with you at home, will allow all of our learners to master their basic facts by the time they leave us at the end of Year 6. Our structured approach means that we will be tracking children in basic facts thoroughly, making sure that no one falls through the gaps. Basic facts are the 'nuts and bolts' of maths. The consistency across classes assists the children as they move through year groups, to know what is expected of them. Our 3 syndicates ask for your support in practising at home too. Our teachers will be sending home examples of things you can do at home to ensure your child's/children's success.
