### Principal's Message

Kia ora koutou,

#### Welcome Back!!

We are very pleased to be back. After just 2 and a bit days back the feeling around the school is amazing. It is calm, focussed and really a wonderful place in the world to be. We have an outstanding team of teachers, support staff, office crew, BoT and grounds/cleaning staff. Every person on the team is skilled at what they do. The children are smiling and seem very happy to be here.

#### Whakatau – welcome to new children and families

We have our termly welcome whakatau in the school hall at 2 pm on Friday 16<sup>th</sup> February. Please come along if your child is new to Silverstream School since our last whakatau in Week 2 of Term 4 2023. We would love the opportunity to welcome you to the Silverstream whanau.

#### Sabbatical

As some of you will be aware I have been fortunate to be awarded a Sabbatical from the start of week 3 until the end of Term 2 this year. In my absence Mr Corey White will take over as Acting Principal with Nicola Bonsey as Acting Deputy and Marian Mullender as Acting Assistant Principal and Learning Support Co-ordinator. I am very appreciative of the Board of Trustees for allowing me to undertake some further study into the science of reading and the science of mathematics. This should help inform and adjust how we teach to ensure the biggest impact on students' academic outcomes and love of learning.

#### Ministerial Advisory Group (MAG)

As part of my sabbatical time I have been invited to be part of the Ministerial Advisory Group on Curriculum Review. This work is to help refresh the requirements for reading, writing and mathematics ready for implementation across all NZ Primary and Intermediate schools from January 2025. I am very honoured to be selected with just one other NZ Principal to be a part of the group.

#### **Board Update**

A huge thank you to Anthony Tebbutt and Tory Slee who have both served on the school board. Anthony as Chairperson (Presiding Member) for the last 3 years. They have both resigned from this year. We are very fortunate to have such amazing people in our community who give up their time to commit to the governance of such a large and high performing school.

Your Board of Trustees meet every week 4 and week 8 of the term. Mr Craig Stevenson was elected as Silverstream Board Presiding Member (BoT Chair) for the 2024 year. We are very pleased to have Craig give his time to support us in this role on top of his day to day role at HIBS.

#### Weekly Assemblies

We continue this year with weekly assemblies every Friday in the school hall from 2 pm - 3 pm, everyone is very welcome to come along.

#### School books/stationery

Many, many thanks to everyone who has got their stationery already ready. It gives teachers a chance to get the books set up well and ensure we can get straight into maths, handwriting, spelling and writing right from week 1.

### School donation – a big thank you

A huge thank you to everyone who has already paid the school donation — you are amazing. We are so reliant on the donations as we are not eligible for the government donation scheme as our equity index (decile) is too high to receive any additional funding. We have the lowest per student funding ratio and also aren't able to be part of the donation scheme. It does leave us very dependent on parents being able to pay the donation to continue to provide teacher aides, paper, art materials, science materials and PE equipment for the children.

If you haven't yet got around to the school donation, I do know things are tough for families at the moment but any amount really does help us make the books balance.

### DONATIONS TO SILVERSTREAM SCHOOL

For the Board to provide quality education and up to date resources that we all expect for our children, we need to raise a large amount of community funds. This is to meet the difference between our Government Grant and our ongoing expenditure. Our ability to offer additional services such as Reading Recovery and IT and other programmes is heavily dependent on money raised from parent donations, the fundraising team and Community grants.

Silverstream School Board of Trustees has set the 2024 school donations as follows:

First and/or only child - \$220 Second child in the family - \$200 No donation is requested for subsequent children in the family Families are CAPPED at \$420 in total per family

### All donations are tax deductible.

Kindo will provide a link to a tax receipt so you can complete your claim. You can claim tax credits for donations of more than \$5. You can claim 33.33 cents of your total donations.

Silverstream School collects all donations and payments via the KINDO app or alternatively payments can be made through the school office via eftpos/cash.

Kindo allows you to load money in intervals affordable to you and use the balance to offset payables and/or donations.



### **KINDO** (Donations/Payables)

If you are new to Silverstream School you would have received a link for KINDO for your child/ren. If you have not yet received a copy of the link please contact the school office.

All donations (tax deductible) and payables (not tax deductible) are loaded into KINDO.

All payables incur GST and are owed by the child's parents to the school. These could be for an external activity your child has chosen to undertake such as touch, basketball, netball or the ICAS exams.

### **LUNCHES**

There is an option to purchase lunch items via the Ezlunch within the KINDO app. The businesses and menus are included, with specific cut off times daily. These are delivered to the school office and taken to the classroom by the senior helpers.

#### *MERCHANDISE*

The school shop has the option to purchase house t-shirts, school polo shirts and school/house hats.

If you have any trouble with loading your KINDO account or the KINDO app, please contact 0508 4 KINDO (0508 4 54636), they are amazing and deal with any problems quickly.


You must be willing to be police vetted. One of our other volunteers will show you what they do, and, as soon as you feel confident, you'll start.

### STUDENT INFORMATION FORMS





### **After School and Saturday Computer Classes**




