Kia ora koutou,

We are already in Week 5 of the term. Although I was unable to attend assembly last week, it was great to hear that our Student Councillors were introduced and ran a fantastic assembly, and our House Captains are getting into their work.

First of all, a big congratulations to our 2024 School Councillors: *Rishi Dhawan,* Sena Reid, Emma Darvill, Sienna Jahnke, Marco Johnston, Shantao Meng, Ruby Wheeler, Evangeline Ting, Harvey D'Arcy-Wright, Alicia Johnston, Kaylee Schiphorst, Aaryan Garud, Adam Hutar, Isla Peters and Eddie Lee. We have assigned staff to focus on walking alongside and growing the leadership skills of our House Captains and School Councillors on a weekly basis.

We are trying to match skill sets with what is needed for leadership roles and jobs, with our Year 6 students. There are still many other opportunities for leadership in: The Learning Hub; as Arts Captains; School Choir; Sports Captains; Chess Club; AV/ICT; Envirogroup; Craft Club; Pokemon group; Pasifika Group, and the Silverstream Trappers to name a few.

Over the past week our programmes are really starting to take shape. On Thursday we began Kapa Haka across the whole school, and on Friday began our Extension Te reo and Mandarin lessons. These programmes will be opened up to wider groups as we build on the capabilities of the first cohort.

As a school we are aiming to be the best we can be, and we try to cater for children of all interests to make their experiences at Silverstream be as rich as possible.
